Baltimore has a humid subtropical climate with hot summers and mild winters. The city has a diverse population, with a mix of long-time residents, young professionals and students. Still, Baltimore stands out as a more affordable option among major metropolitan areas.

Whether you're craving Maryland crab or international cuisine, Baltimore offers a wide range of dining options. For local seafood, try L.P. Steamers or Captain James Landing. If you're looking for an upscale dining experience, Azumi is a sophisticated Japanese grill located inside the Four Seasons Hotel. For a quick meal, be sure to visit well-known food halls such as the Broadway Market or the Lexington Market, which is the oldest continuously running market in America.





Baltimore offers a vibrant mix of cultural events year-round. ArtScape, the nation's largest free art festival, takes place every August, while the Fell's Point Fun Festival celebrates the neighborhood's history with local vendors and live music each fall. In the spring, the Charm City Bluegrass Festival showcases top regional talent in traditional bluegrass and roots music.







Stroll along the scenic Inner Harbor, where you can enjoy waterfront views, visit historic ships or take a boat tour. For a taste of local history, wander through Fell's Point, a historic neighborhood known for its 18th-century buildings, vibrant pubs and a scenic waterfront. If you're looking to enjoy nature, Patterson Park is a great place for picnics and walking, while also offering stunning views from its historic pagoda.

Baltimore is home to the NFL's Baltimore Ravens and the MLB's Baltimore Orioles. Whether you're a die-hard sports fan or want to simply join in the fun, don't miss the Orioles Opening Day at Camden Yards and take part in this unofficial local holiday. To get a glimpse of horse racing, be sure to watch the Preakness Stakes at Pimlico Racecourse, the second oldest racetrack in the nation.





Baltimore offers a range of activities for both families and adults. Spend the day at the National Aquarium or the Baltimore Museum of Art, then check out the Maryland Science Center or the zoo for fun educational experiences. Alternatively, many locals like to catch a comedy show at the Illusions Bar & Theater or classical music at the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra.
