The climate features cold, snowy winters and warm, humid summers. Seasonal changes are celebrated, with vibrant autumn foliage and springtime festivals drawing both locals and tourists alike.

Boston has a diverse and vibrant dining scene with something to satisfy every craving. If you're in the mood for fresh seafood, head to the Boston Sail Loft, known for its generous portions and waterfront views. For a more casual atmosphere, Quincy Market is a must-visit, packed with over 50 food vendors offering everything from lobster rolls to international street food. Don't miss the North End, the city's iconic Italian neighborhood. Grab a Sicilian-inspired meal at Carmelina's then top it off with a sweet treat from Mike's Pastry, where the cannoli are legendary.





Boston is filled with cultural events all year long. From the Boston Marathon and St. Patrick's Day Festival in the spring to Harborfest in the summer and the Head of the Charles Regatta in the fall, there's always something exciting happening. To explore Boston's rich colonial history, walk the Freedom Trail or visit the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum. Art and history lovers should also stop by the Museum of Fine Arts or the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, both of which house world-class collections. If you're drawn to music, catch a performance by the Boston Pops or the renowned Boston Symphony Orchestra.

Boston's outdoor spaces have something for everyone. The Charles River Esplanade is a 17-mile path that stretches along the river and is perfect for walking or biking. The Boston Common and the Public Garden offer peaceful green spaces in the heart of the city ideal for a picnic or people-watching. To explore Boston's diverse neighborhoods, take a walk along the Boston HarborWalk, which connects Seaport, Charlestown and the North End to the harbor. If you're up for a short ferry ride, the Boston Harbor Islands make for a great day trip, offering hiking, beaches and skyline views.

Boston is one of the most passionate sports cities in the country, filled with loyal and spirited fans. If you enjoy baseball, catch a Red Sox game at Fenway Park, the oldest ballpark in Major League Baseball. If you're into basketball or hockey, watch the Celtics or Bruins play at TD Garden. Just outside the city, football fans can cheer on the New England Patriots at Gillette Stadium, a team with multiple Super Bowl championships. Boston also boasts competitive college sports, especially in football and hockey, with schools like Harvard, Northeastern and Boston College leading the way.





Boston offers a vibrant and diverse entertainment scene that caters to every interest. Theater lovers can catch Broadway shows in the Theatre District at venues like the Boston Opera House and Emerson Colonial Theatre. For live music, the city hosts everything from big-name concerts at TD Garden and Fenway Park to intimate performances at venues like The House of Blues. Boston also features outdoor events like the Boston Calling Music Festival and Shakespeare on the Common. Comedy fans can enjoy a set at The Wilbur or the Improv Asylum in the North End.

Boston's major employers span healthcare, education, biotechnology and finance. Leading the pack are Mass General Brigham (formerly Partners HealthCare), one of the largest healthcare providers in the region, and Harvard University, one of the city's largest nongovernment employers. Biotech and pharmaceutical giants such as Moderna and Biogen have headquarters or major operations in the area.

For a perfect weekend getaway from Boston, head to Newport, Rhode Island to explore historic mansions, walk the scenic Cliff Walk, and enjoy fresh seafood by the harbor. During the summer, Provincetown at the tip of Cape Cod offers beautiful beaches, a lively arts scene and a welcoming, vibrant atmosphere just a quick ferry ride or drive away. For something more peaceful and nature-filled, the Berkshires in Western Massachusetts offer hiking, charming small towns and cultural spots like Tanglewood and the MASS MoCA. Each destination offers its own unique charm, whether you're looking for seaside fun or a relaxing retreat.
