
DENVER, COLORADO Outdoor Activities, Sports & Entertainment





Denver presents an unparalleled experience for those who love the great outdoors. Start your adventure at the Rocky Mountain Arsenal National Wildlife Refuge with over 20 miles of trails and two lakes perfect for biking, hiking and fishing. Don't miss the auto tour which stretches 11 miles and gives visitors a front-seat experience of Denver wildlife. For breathtaking views of the city and the Rockies, take a trip out to Lookout Mountain, which is situated about 7,200 feet above the city of Golden.

Denver is home to professional teams like the Broncos (NFL), Rockies (MLB), Nuggets (NBA) and Avalanche (NHL), drawing fans to venues such as Empower Field and Coors Field. Outdoor activities, including skiing, hiking and mountain biking, are accessible within an hour's drive of the city. Residents participate in or watch sports year-round, thanks to the city's active and sportsfocused community.





Denver is home to the iconic Red Rocks Amphitheatre, which is often claimed to be "acoustically perfect."
